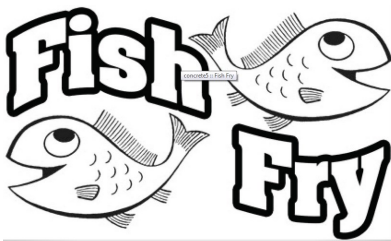

Pastor's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
Even though I'm a fan of technology, it seems like there's no escaping it, even if you wanted to. In our modern, digital world, it's easy to work around the clock: our cell phones are always on and everyone expects their text messages and emails to be answered instantaneously. You might even crawl into bed with your phone, checking out your Facebook updates or playing a game to "wind down." It's safe to say that for most of us, our work and our technology can consume our days and our nights. Citizens of the ancient world saw no such conveniences, of course. They entertained themselves in other ways, usually in groups: true face-to-face fellowship at its finest. Even still, they managed to be distracted from the ways of the Lord. God wants our attention. God wants to be He who consumes your thoughts every day and every night. It might seem impossible; after all, how many of us are living in monastic settings?

The psalmist writes:

But his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. —Psalm 1:2

He who is close to the Lord is the same one who meditates on holy things night and day. How can that translate for us, in our world, with all of our distractions and responsibilities? As we ready ourselves for Christ's death and resurrection, we should turn ourselves to prayer. Lent is a prime time for investigating God's word, spending time in prayer, and meditating on Scripture. Ask God to help you carve out more time to spend in His holy presence, and He will. Even though you may not lead a monk-like lifestyle, the more we spend time talking to God and (even more importantly) *listening* to God, the more our thoughts return to Him and His ways. Through regular prayer and reflection on Scripture, we become more like Him and it becomes possible to spend our days and nights thinking godly things. This Lenten season, I invite you to join me as we dedicate more time to God through quiet times of prayer, meditation, and reflection.

Annual Congregational Meeting Minutes

January 17, 2016 Congregation

Change to p.9: Choir Appreciation Fund should be \$3,849.03

Rick called meeting to order at 9:22 a.m.

Pastor opened in prayer.

Ratification of Bylaws & Constitution:

Motion to accept by Renee Zimmer, 2nd by Linda.

Ratification passed.

Secretary's report: Motion to accept by Diane Osantowski, 2nd by Linda Babechenko.

General Fund Treasurer's Report: Given by Jan. Motion to accept by Jennifer Kuehnemund, 2nd by Deva Weber.

Approval of Benevolence Distribution: Rick asked the congregation if we should stick with the current ministries or add any new ministries. Renee Zimmer asked if it can be brought to council if any other organizations come to mind. The council said that they would need any new names at the beginning of the quarter. Motion to accept by Linda Babechenko, 2nd by Renee Zimmer.

Approval of 2016 Budget: Budget was on the handout, not the one in the packet. Motion to accept by Jim Jasman, 2nd by Robbie Oldenburg.

Vote for Council Members with Open

Nominations From the Floor: Rick asked for any nominations from the floor. Jennifer Rupprecht was added to the ballot from the floor nominations. Council members that are outgoing are Darla Kolomak, Kevin White, Linda Babechenko. Harold Avery, Dale Bremer and Maria Wagner have served their first term but are on the ballot for their second term. Tom Janson is running for President, Tim Elbers is running for Vice President and Nancy Sylvester is running for Special Funds Treasurer. Other general council nominees are Alex Squanda, Deb Sigleko, and Isaac Zimmer. Motion to accept by Dale Bremer, 2nd by Linda Babechenko.

Ministry Of Finance: Tom let the congregation know that the parking lot needs to have the lines redone, sealed and some asphalt work done. The boiler will probably need to be replaced, the windows on the south side of the parsonage need to be replaced and we would like to get air condi-

tioning for the church. There is \$50,000 for Harry Bader that has not been touched. Anything over \$5,000 has to be voted on by the congregation. He asked if we wanted to vote on spending \$25,000 or less to be used for air conditioning today? Jennifer Kuehnemund asked if there has been a cost analysis done to see how much it will cost to run the air conditioners. Rick said not yet. The units do run off of electricity and are permanent in the wall. Tom said you wouldn't see it. Linda Babechenko made a motion to give council permission to use \$30,000 of Harry Bader's money for the air conditioning units and electrical. 2nd by Jennifer Shores. Diane Osantowski was concerned about the electrical cost to run the air conditioning. Council will need to come back to the congregation with coast ideas. Mike Connelly was worried about the boiler going and only heating the sanctuary. Dorothy VanOchten questioned if we are looking into using the same people for the boiler and the air conditioning to get a better price. The air conditioning and boiler are run on two separate systems. Vote was passed. One opposed. Motion made to accept the Ministry of Finance Report by Tim Elbers. 2nd by Cathy.
