The Call Committee has invited Pastor Ed Kloos and his wife Mary back to Christ Lutheran for the weekend of May 29th - June 2nd. Pastor Ed will be presiding at all three worship services on Sunday, May 31st. If you missed Pastor Ed on May 17th here is another chance to introduce yourself and get to know more about them. The call committee and church council will meet jointly at 2:00 p.m. Sunday afternoon to vote on having the congregation extend a call to Dr. Edward Kloos. Refreshments will be served after each service.

Pastor Ed is from Yonkers, NY, he received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Wagner College, Master of Divinity from New Brunswick Theological Seminary, and Master of Sacred Theology from New York Theological Seminary. He has served as Pastor at First Congregational Church of Woodbridge New Jersey, and United Christian Church of Copiague New York. He is currently a pastoral counselor and has directed many pastoral programs for veteran homes, assisted living facilities, and health organizations.

He also has a strong musical background; you need to hear him play the organ!

Message From Our President:

Dear Members,

The Congregation has many projects that are moving forward. There seems to be some confusion of the process and reasoning.

The constitutions and bylaws had to be completed. Those documents are the foundation for structure of the Church.

The Call Committee is in the process of calling a full time pastor. They have had many two hour face to face interviews via the internet. Each candidate that makes it to the final interview gets invited to visit and preach. The Call Committee then recommends that candidate to the Council. The Council then communicates with the prospective pastor, what we expect from them and what they can expect from us. That packet includes their salary, benefits, housing and other allowances. After mutually concluding that they would except the call, the congregation will be given a chance to voice their opinion and vote to call the prospective pastor. In order to pass, the motion must receive at least two thirds positive

vote. A formal call letter is then sent.

The Worship and Music Committee is meeting monthly. The 8 o'clock service is the traditional service. It is their intent to always have a traditional service. They are trying new things at the 10:30 service to make it more of a blended service. Some things have been added that heighten the worship experience and other things not so much. They are fully aware of the extended time of the service. Each section of the service is being timed and discussed at the next meeting.

The things that are currently being discussed are, bringing back the order of service in the bulletin. Starting the service on time. Not spending as much time on announcements. Not substituting a hymn with a video during communion. Staying within the allotted time for sermons. Reducing time allotted for Minutes with Martin. The process of communion. Projecting the page numbers of the hymns as long as possible on the screen prior to the song. Setting up a suggestion box in the hall for constructive comments.

An audit of the books from 2011 to date will be completed soon. After several hours of reconstructing each account, Chris Bublitz reported "I did not find any accounts indicating any signs of misappropriation of funds. However, some account balances do not accurately reflect the correct balances in each fund." Those accounts will be corrected and reported to the council as soon as possible. The completion of the audit will be verified by at least three other people. Distributions will be made from appropriate accounts as soon as possible. The executive committee met to discuss the implementation of Quickbooks. The accounting software should simplify the bookkeeping process.

The Lighting Committee has asked the Executive Committee to help re-evaluate the project. It has been concluded that the current proposed plan is not a feasible solution. Most of the lights have been sent back and reordered to meet our needs. We will stay well within the \$13,000 budget voted on by the congregation.

Many of you may not be aware that someone has been coming into the church at night and stealing toilet paper. Strange as it may seem, nothing else appears to be missing.

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A trail camera picture indicated it was a young man wearing a hooded sweatshirt. Further action is being discussed with Chief Hadd.

The Trust Committee has met a few times to re-evaluate the wording and purpose of the Trust. I believe their goal is to make small yet appropriate changes to accommodate our current needs. Upon completion the trust will be signed and brought to council for approval. I believe a vote will be brought to the congregation for final approval at the annual meeting if not before.

The members of the Baptismal Font Committee have met twice. The font has leaked many times over the years and the fiberglass has worn away. It has been patched but never refurbished. They are attempting to gather information from the company that built it and companies that service hot tubs. The basic concept of its design is the same as a small hot tub. No action has been concluded.

There has been some discussion about the removal of a few pews in the area by the baptismal font. That discussion is being considered for two reasons. First, relocating some of the short pews to the main seating area may serve our wheelchair and walker members better. That would allow them to see the screen and not feel uncomfortable sitting in or blocking the aisle. Secondly, relocating a few pews could make more room for people that are willing to play other instruments. The Memorial Fund Committee has purchased new chairs for the fellowship hall. That committee meets from time to time and discusses the wants and needs of the church that are not budgeted items. It looks at the current Memorial Fund balance and brings request to the council. Currently the fund balance is over \$20,000. That money can not be used as a general fund account. They may buy things like choir robes, music, kitchen faucets and chairs.

The Sunday night service called The One Service is now ready to advertise and feels confident the sound system, screen and projector are operational. They have grown from Amanda and a presiding pastor to at least three and up to five young committed band members. The service has had as many as thirty five in attendance. They have had members and many non-members at-

tend. Although summer is quickly approaching and may not be the best time to start an attendance campaign, they would like to move forward. I would like to take this time to remind people of the history of The One Service. It was started by members of the church that had a vision of attracting younger people that no longer come to our church or any church. The service was completely funded until January by three families. Those families assured me it did not affect the amount given in their weekly offering.

The service was hampered by a defective projector and screen. Many hours were spent in preparation to create a heightened experience with God only to have a technical malfunction disrupting the entire hour. Finally, the technicians from the sound company admitted they had miscalculated the capability of the system and ran a cable to the sound room at no additional cost to the congregation.


Unfortunately, many people who attended those services were disappointed and many never returned. Although there may be members of our congregation that do not care for that style of service, I ask this question. How many services in this congregation have had improved attendance over the last year? This one has.

The One Service has grown from a few to an average of about fifteen. Those young people are on fire for the Lord and leave church rejoicing in it. I have left that service many time over the last six months and have not heard one concern about the length of the service. The content of the message or the songs that were sung. Remember, our publicized Purpose Statement proclaims that we will.

Faithfully celebrate God's love through worship
Assemble the lost to Christ
Illuminate God's love by meeting other's needs
Train one another to discover God's plan
Help equip the people of Christ to do the
ministry of the church.

Please pray for our all our committees and our entire congregation.

Rick called meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Devotion given by Rick. Darla will not be here next month. Dale to do devotions next month.

Monthly Reports:

Secretary's report: Submitted by Kelly Walz. Motion to accept by Harold, 2nd by Dale.

Current Expense Fund: Motion to accept by Harold, 2nd by Ellen.

Check Register Reports: Checks #27993 thru #28030. Motion to accept by Darla, 2nd by Harold.

Building and Memorial Funds: 2013 check for \$15,000 (currently in a Thrivent fund) will be accounted for in the Endowment Fund. Found through audit. No money being moved until after audit is done. Motion to accept by Harold, 2nd by Kelly.

Ministry of Finance: No money being moved until after audit.

Ministry Of Property: New flag is needed. Rich Sylvester will take care of it.

Ministry Of Worship: Report submitted. Darlene was going to be asked which piano she needs for choir. Questioned about why choir didn't sing for Confirmation and will they sing for Graduation. Sue was going to find out.

Social Ministry and Outreach and Ministry of Congregational Life: Nothing to report.

Ministry of Education: Position still available

for Sunday School Superintendent position. Linda to post in the newsletter and bulletin.

Ministry of Communications: Nothing to report.

Ministry of Youth & Family: Nothing to report.

Pastoral Report: Sue did 2 hospital visits, 1 nursing home visit in April. 4 hospital visits in May, attended the National Day of Prayer, and plans to do the Baccalaureate on June 3rd.

Office Reports: Nothing to report.

Youth Report: Rich submitted report. Requesting prayer for the church and for the Search Committee.

Unfinished Business: Electrical – Due to the dysfunction of the dimmer control in the sanctuary and the incompatibility of the use of the LED lights with the system, it is recommended to return all purchases from Medler Electric for the sanctuary. Because of the expected cost to repair the dimmer control it is recommended to return all other LED bulbs and internal lighting purchased and rebid for T8 fluorescents to save money for the dimmer control. The ballasts purchased will be used. Keep 19 of the LED's for the overflow room and if possible send back 7 of the 400 watt outside lights. The sanctuary will be rebid and also the bulbs for the fellowship hall, kitchen, couch area and offices. Rod Wagner will reinstate for rebate.

New Business: Trust Report – Trustees are to manage all funds. Members of the committee will come to council for what is O.K. to be used. Endowment funds should be used for international, national and local ministries. The investment policy is in the Trust. Special funds treasurer will account for funds spent.

Audit Report - Chris Bublitz did the audit. We have the letter sent by Chris. The General Fund owes the Memorial fund \$1,914.12. Chris

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recommends we have better record keeping. Deva will audit the General Fund and a CPA will look over everything. A motion was made to purchase QuickBooks, at no charge to the congregation, and to have it installed and implemented as soon as possible.

Call Committee Report – Would like Pastor Edward Kloos and his wife to come back and run all three Sunday services. The Call Committee and Council are to meet the afternoon that Pastor Kloos preaches and vote on whether or not to call Pastor Kloos and have the Call Packet in his hands before he leaves barring that there are no issues at the services. Motion to bring Pastor Kloos back made by Tom, 2nd by Darla.

Motion to pay for his expenses made by Tom and 2nd by Darla.

Rich Sylvester thinks the council needs to look into adding a conflict of interest policy to the constitution.

Blue Jean Sunday will be May 31st for lawn clean-up and other various cleanup around the church.

Motion to adjourn accepted.

The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Talked to someone who does recording about what type of a camera would be compatible to record the services onto a DVD. He recommended that we could get a good quality camera for less than \$600.

Sound Room: A new camera would eliminate the TV screen.

Remodeling of the sound room is on hold until Consumers does a walk thru of the church and plans can be made as to what the best approach would be when the rest of the lighting will be done.
