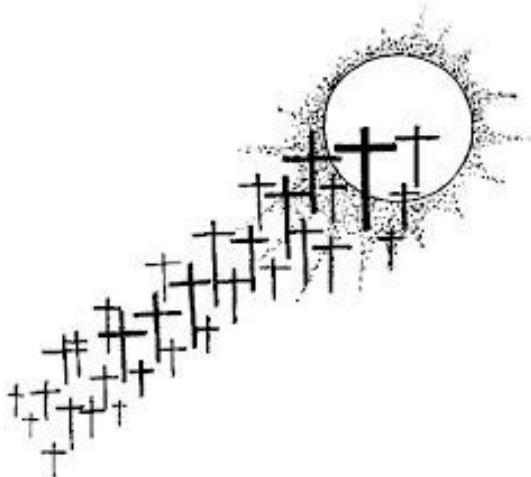

Dear Members of Christ Lutheran Family,

On October 5th - 8th, Pastor Sue, Dorothy Arlt, Dale Bremer, Renee' and I attended the LCMC Annual Gathering in Des Moines, Iowa. We were encouraged by the LCMC to advertise our call for a senior pastor to all 1083 attendees. They introduced us from the main stage. Then after that session, we handed out our **Rejoice In Your Faith** fliers created by our call committee as people were exiting. A copy of this flyer is displayed on the bulletin board here at the main entrance of church. We were able to speak with pastors personally that are looking for a call. Dale, Renee' and I spent some time with one pastor that has sent his resume' to the call committee. There were a few more that just introduced themselves to us. We have since received resume's from them as well.

The Gathering was very uplifting and educational. The breakout sessions that I attended were "Calling a Pastor", "The Call Process" and "A Well Run Council Meeting". Renee', Dale, Sue and Dorothy attended different sessions. One of the keynote speakers was a history professor that spoke about Luther's writings. The two hour session provided insight to the church and corruption that occurs when men assume power over a period of time. The message, even though it wasn't specifically stated, was quite clear. The LCMC is run by people of the church for the people of the church, much like how our forefathers designed the American Constitution.

On October 12th I held an open forum between the 8 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. services. The intent of the meeting was to answer any questions about the business of the church. An overview of the call committee's progress was given. They have a dozen or more resume's and will be interviewing pastors very soon. The council will be presenting a preliminary budget in November. This should give members adequate time to review and ask questions prior to the annual meeting. Our trust document will be slightly modified to name the LCMC as beneficiary instead of the ELCA if the church should ever dissolve. There is no reason to think that this would happen, but it needs to be addressed. This change will be voted on at the

annual meeting. We currently have over \$100,000 in the Endowment Fund. The interest will be published at the end of the year and distributed in January of 2015. The Education Scholarship Fund will continue as always. Distributions will be based on the recommendations of that committee.

And now the journey begins anew...When God calls your name and leads you to a new section of the path He has prepared for you, it's best to just step forward in faith to see where the journey leads you. The Lord has laid on my heart that in this time of life, we all need to be a little stronger in our understanding of why we believe and what we believe to be able to withstand the challenges to our faith from the world around us. As a response to that leading, I have introduced "Moments with Martin" into the worship experience on Sunday mornings. For a few minutes each Sunday morning, we will take a look at some of the teachings and writings of Martin Luther so that we can better understand the basics of our Lutheran faith. We are taking advantage of the years of research and study that Luther undertook to explain the teachings of Christ in a way that is easily understood by the common person.

We have started with the Ten Commandments in our "Moments" together, and have remembered that the first three commandments identify and explain our relationship with God. Martin Luther tells us that the first and most important com-

mandment is to have no other gods before our Creator. We are not to let anything come before our total and utter dependence on God for all we need. The second commandment teaches faith and how to call on the name of the Lord when it teaches us to not take the Lord's name in vain. The third commandment teaches us how to honor God by setting time aside each week to focus our thoughts and energies on those things that God desires for us through our gathering to worship Him in fellowship with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Be sure to join us Sunday mornings and see if you can get "kissed" in our Moments with Martin!

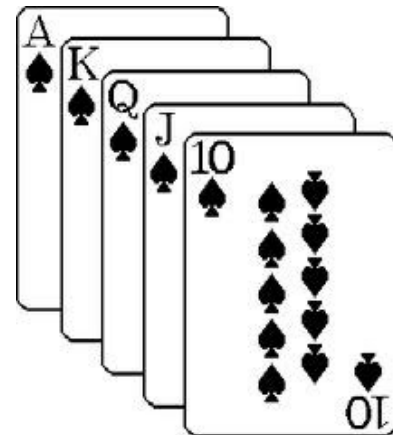
