As I approach ministry this fall I am excited for Christ Lutheran Church. I am excited to see the direction God will be taking her, excited to see the members of Christ Lutheran Church step up and take on more ministry roles and I am excited for the opportunity to spend some time teaching in God's Word about the God centered and Biblical Roles of Men and Women, but before we get too excited we have to say a very difficult Goodbye!!!

Most Pastor's in there early 50's have become set in their ways of doing ministry, most are rigid and not fluid. This is very typical in any profession and ministry is no different. However, Pastor Tom came in with an open heart and open approach to doing ministry. This was very exciting for me, because we could come up with ideas together and take a partnership approach to ministry, especially when it pertained to your youth.

I also got to see a man exemplify servant leadership. He was always there helping to hang Christmas Tree Lights, or clean up the church yard. When there was a project that needed to

be done he was always there to take care of it or lend a hand with it. The greatest example of his servant leadership for me was watching him take our church through the change from ELCA to the LCMC. It took a special person, a servant leader to navigate us through that tough time and we are all so blessed to have Pastor Tom at the helm during that time. As the church moves forward and becomes more modern and more relevant to our community and culture, while keeping the truth and faith God has trusted her with, we will look back and remember Pastor Tom and his servant leadership being the start of it all.

Finally, for me I am saying goodbye to doing ministry with a friend, not a co-worker, not a boss, not even a Pastor even though many times he was MY Pastor. I am saying goodbye to my friend, because we are friends we will always keep in touch and spend time together. The difficult part will be that first Wednesday in October, the day my friend and I would meet. We would talk about parenting, politics, and our personal lives in general. We would share and pray for this church, the people, the United States and the World. We would laugh and sometimes cry, and when it was all said and done we would be two brothers in Christ building one another up to be more like our Savior. Thank you Pastor Tom for being my friend and thank your for your ministry!!!!

Answering the Call

I was asked to share my faith walk with God with the congregation and since the most concise version of that story was in my scholarship application, I decided to share that with you all...

God has been an active part of my life for as long as I can remember. In my teens, I came to a deeper understanding of the importance of God in my life, and how active and present He is, following a number of unique events that actively displayed for me the very real presence of evil in the world and its effect on us and our lives. When I was 17, I made a promise to God that I would follow where He led me and would do what He asked me to do as best I was able. I'm proud to say that while I have been reluctant to follow His lead at times, I have honored that promise and have been richly blessed as a result.

I was raised in a Lutheran-Methodist military family and since we moved frequently, received the benefit of a variety of understandings of the nature of God and our relationship with Him. I was confirmed by a Lutheran chaplain while we were living on Langley AFB, Virginia. Our class had to do 3 years of training in 18 months because the Chaplain was being shipped out and wouldn't be able to see our training through to completion. He had a unique way of making the Gospel real, though, and much of what he taught reached my heart.

When I went to college, after we found my dorm, the first thing we did was to find a church family for me to connect to. God lead us to University Lutheran Church in East Lansing and, since my family was out of state, I was "adopted" by a family as their surrogate daughter. It was comforting to have a connection and my church family accepted me and included me in as many of their family events as I was able to attend. I was thankful that these people were both willing and able to reach out to me.

God has always called me to serve His

people. While in high school, I served in a pilot program on "Peer Counseling." We were taught active listening skills and basic counselling techniques, and were made available for our peers to come and talk to us about issues and concerns with which we could identify, so that we could guide and encourage them on dealing with those issues and when they needed to we helped them seek professional support through the administration. In college through my church, I served as a Student Deacon for 4 years, seeking out new students on campus, welcoming them and inviting them to join our student group at church and being available to them as a listening ear and friend. I have always been active in my churches through music, worship and outreach to the community and 11 years ago completed the Lay Ministry Training program through the ELCA.

I have always striven to perform my work duties in light of my relationship with Christ and to show His love to those around me. God has been with me through all of my jobs and has guided me to the next job when it was time to change, so that I might learn the next lesson of importance. Recently, He has pointed me in the direction of a more active, official role in ministry and, while I initially balked at the idea, He was clear about His intention. As always, I am honoring my oath to Him and he has provided the means of training to reach that goal as well as a work environment and church family that allows and encourages following that call. For that I am extremely grateful.

Going forward, I will continue to serve God in whatever manner He asks and, as I am able, will strive to shine the light of Christ's love to a world wrapped in darkness and despair. I have been honored that God would call me to this level of responsibility and pray constantly that I will glorify His name in all that I do.
